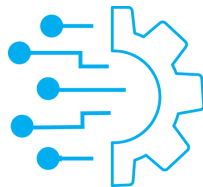
Top Priorities



Increase funding for transportation that does not negatively impact the State Transportation Trust Fund.



Support Vision Zero safety initiatives to reach zero traffic fatalities and serious injuries.








Increase the resiliency and efficiency of Brevard County's transportation system by advancing technological network enhancements.






The Space Coast TPO Supports:

Increased funding for transportation investments

-  Funds the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) at a predictable level.
-  Develop a resilient network of transportation infrastructure and evacuation routes.
-  Establishes flexible and predictable funding for transit projects identified through the metropolitan transportation planning process by removing various funding limitations for the State Transportation Trust Fund (STTF).
-  Study potential revenue replacement options for the current motor fuels tax which can no longer fully support the current or future needs of Florida's transportation system.
-  Charge alternatively fueled vehicles a fee equal to the fuel tax paid by gasoline or diesel-fueled vehicles, such as an electric vehicle registration fee.

BENEFIT: Additional funds and greater flexibility are needed within existing State funding programs to maximize the efficient use of resources, and allow for the transportation investments necessary to serve our rapidly growing urbanized area and support economic growth in our region.

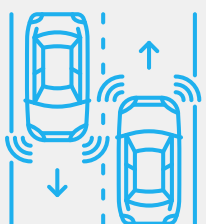
The Space Coast TPO Supports:

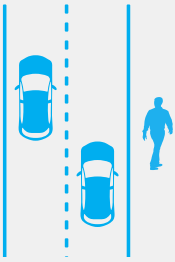
-  **Safety and Innovation**
 - Strengthen existing pedestrian and bicycle safety laws.
 - Engineer and redesign roadways for appropriate speeds.
 - Monitor regulations on distracted driving.

BENEFIT: Would increase roadway safety and make enforcement easier.

-  Support the advancement of innovative transportation mobility solutions and policies that make Florida the national leader in creative approaches to addressing transportation needs, including Autonomous, Connected, Electric, and advanced traffic signals as well as technologies not yet developed.

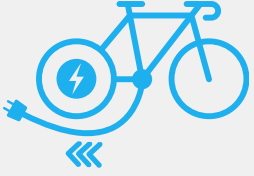
BENEFIT: Improves the efficiency and safety of travel. Cities and states that are proactive in the deployment of transportation technology will be better positioned for success and economic stability in the future.





Support: Move Over For People

Expand the current Move Over law to include people and protect vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, bicyclists, and disabled individuals using mobility devices.



Monitor: Safe Operations for Electric Bicycles & Scooters

Expand the recent Micromobility Law to address safe operation of electric bicycles (e-bikes) and scooters.



Monitor: Hands Free Florida

Regulates distracted driving by prohibiting the use of handheld two-way electronic wireless communications while operating a motor vehicle on any roadway.
